Statement of the Missouri Catholic Conference on the Abortion Initiative Petition

The Catholic Church supports and defends society's most vulnerable, especially women and children, through accompaniment, social services, and material assistance.

A misleading proposed amendment to the Missouri Constitution suggests that a "right to an abortion" is needed to protect women, while the amendment could actually put women at risk and endanger preborn children. This ballot initiative would legalize abortions in this state and remove long standing health and safety standards for women. In addition, this initiative does nothing to reduce or eliminate the underlying social causes for abortion and does not further a true culture of life in the state.

Groups are currently collecting citizen signatures to add the amendment to the November 2024 ballot. We encourage all Catholics and people of good will to not sign any petition that would put this amendment on the ballot.

The Catholic Church in Missouri will continue to provide spiritual and material support to expectant mothers and their families through our parishes and ministries, and to advocate on their behalf and on behalf of their preborn children. For those women suffering from the pain of an abortion, the Church will continue to offer true healing and hope through its Post Abortive Healing Ministries. We ask all to help us in these efforts to safeguard the right to life.

We look forward to the day when every child, born and unborn, has the love and support needed to thrive and reach his or her full potential. Let us pray for a greater recognition of the gift of each and every human life in our society.

Divine Mercy Sunday

This Second Sunday of Easter is celebrated as "Divine Mercy Sunday." As feast days go, Divine Mercy Sunday is relatively new. Established in 2000 by Saint John Paul II, Divine Mercy Sunday was first revealed to Saint Faustina Kowalska in the 1930s. During a series of apparitions, the Lord told Faustina, in part:

"I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and a shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners.... The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment.... My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or of angel, will be able to fathom it throughout eternity."

Saint John Paul II held a fondness for Divine Mercy Sunday throughout his life. When he officially established the feast day on the second Sunday of Easter, Pope John Paul II reiterated the power of God's mercy towards all of His children:

"To all of humanity, who often appear lost and overwhelmed by the prevalence of evil, self-centeredness, and fear, the Risen Lord extends His loving gift - a love that forgives, brings reconciliation, and renews hope within the soul.'

A wonderful way to venerate the image of the Divine Mercy and to meditate more deeply on Divine Mercy is to pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet. To pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet, you use your rosary beads, but use different prayers. For more information, visit:

Back in 2015, in declaring the Jubilee Year of Mercy, Pope Francis taught that "at times, we are called to gaze even more attentively on mercy to that we may become a more effective sign of the Father's action in our lives" (Misericordiæ Vultus, Nº 3.1). In addition, Pope St. John Paul II issued a plenary indulgence for the faithful who go to Confession, actively participate in Divine Mercy Sunday Mass, and pray for the intentions of the Holy TConfido in Te. Giêsu Father.

"Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world!"
