## Coming Attractions!

Next Sunday is the “Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe.” This celebration is often simply called the “Feast of Christ the King.” This is a newer celebration, established first by Pope Pius XI 97 years ago in 1925. “Once men recognize, both in private and in public life, that Christ is King, society will at last receive the great blessings of real liberty, well-ordered discipline, peace and harmony,” Pope Pius taught. “The result will be,” he continued, “a stable peace and tranquility, for there will be no longer any cause of discontent” (*Quas Primas*, № 19). Pope Pius originally set this celebration for the last weekend of October. Saint Paul VI promoted this celebration to a solemnity and moved it to the final Sunday of the liturgical year so that “the eschatological importance of this Sunday is better highlighted” (*Calendarium Romanum*, III, 2). As we prepare for this celebration; we should consider what it means to have a king and how willing we are to let Jesus be our King.

Here in the United States almost everyone, Catholics, non-Catholic Christians, other faithful people (Jews, Muslims, Buddhists, Hindus, etc.), even atheists celebrate Thanksgiving. The word for “thanksgiving” in Greek is “εὐχαριστία” (*eucharistia*). There are few better ways of offering thanks to Almighty God than celebrating the Eucharist together. Fr. Fox will be offering a Thanksgiving Day Mass on Wednesday, November 23 at 6:00 *pm* at Blessed Sacrament, Bethany and on Thursday, November 24 at 9:00 *am* at Saint Joseph, Trenton. Please consider celebrating, εὐχαριστία, Thanksgiving, together with your faith family.

Speaking of Christ the King Sunday, Bishop Johnston has given Father Bill Fox the faculties to administer the Sacrament of Confirmation to our young sister Emma E. (Emma was unable to attend the Mass where our other recent *Confirmandi* received the Sacrament from the Bishop.) Emma will be Confirmed at Mass on the evening of November 19<sup>th</sup>. Following Mass that evening, our Women’s Group ministry will be organizing a reception for all of our young *Confirmandi*. Blessed Sacrament parishioners, please make an effort to participate and celebrate our young sisters and brothers.

As noted, Christ the King Sunday is the last Sunday in Ordinary Time, which makes the following Sunday, the November 27, the first Sunday in Advent. In an effort to use the whole *Roman Missal* throughout the course of the liturgical year, we will change-up some of our practice at Mass for the season:

We will be using the second form of the Penitential Act at Mass followed by the Κύριε, ἐλέησον (*Kyrie, eléison*, “Lord, have mercy”) in Greek. We will also do the *Sanctus* (“Holy, Holy Holy”) and the *Agnus Dei* (“Lamb of God”) in Latin. We will also start using the second option for the *Mysterium Fidei* (the “Mystery of Faith”). That text reads “When we eat this Bread and drink this Cup, we proclaim your Death, O Lord, until you come again.” Please watch for worship aids for these tweaks.
